INTRODUCTION

From a modest beginning in 1997, Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT) has evolved into a multi-disciplinary University, respected worldwide for its culture of educational excellence. The excellent academic ambience, quality faculty, adherence to strict academic rigor and plethora of other academic activities led to grant of university status under Section 3 of UGC Act 1956 to the institute by the Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India in the year 2004, within just six years of its inception. More recently, in 2014, MHRD conferred Category 'A' status and NBA of AICTE accredited it in Tier 1 (Washington Accord), placing KIIT among the most elite universities of the country.

KIIT University's cosmopolitan campus is proud to have more than 25,000 students from all corners of India and around 39 countries. The constituent schools contiguously located

in impeccably landscaped and modern-technology-enabled campuses, offering graduate, post-graduate, doctoral and post-doctoral programmes in a wide range of disciplines. The University has taken steps to provide impetus to research and development activity – both by faculty and the students. More than 100 R&D projects are currently underway supported by several national and international agencies. Similarly, students' projects have won high appreciation at all levels.

The institute's strong focus on research and academic collaborations has been drawing academics and scholars from around the world and has led it to alliance with over 140 globally reputed institutions abroad and membership in many national and international educational associations and bodies like International Association of Universities (IAU), Association of Indian Universities (AIU), Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU),

University Mobility of Asia and the Pacific (UMAP), Eurasian Silk Road Universities Consortium (ESRUC), United Nations Academic Impact (UNAI), etc.

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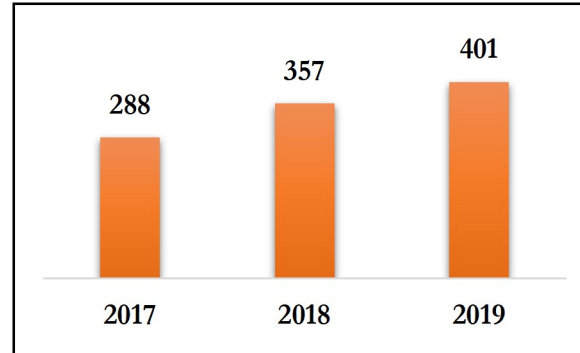
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SDG 1 : NO POVERTY

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 1 associated with No Poverty :

1. Camps were organized in different districts of state of Odisha, India to identify potential youths who were then further trained and made more employable. Counselors available with the University identified the aspirations and talents in particular areas and suggested domains of training to be imparted. The training were imparted by experienced University staff members on use of file handling, communication skills, business communication writing, basic accounting, ICT technology and Digital skills. They were also referred to the Skill Development Center for training in different schemes under Government initiatives. More than 500 such candidates benefited.
2. Vocational training in candle making, diya making, preparing phenyle and incense sticks etc were also taught to make them self independent. 5000+ youth benefited.

3. Special recruitment drives have been organized for the youths leading to economic stability in their families and alleviation of poverty in general.
4. For staffs hailing from poor economic background, the University provided educational support and resources to their children to prevent any disruption in their education. Provision also exists for children of staff members to pursue higher education in the University with full or partial fee waiver.

5. The University is also involved in facilitating education for tribal students through its association with the sister

organization, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) with the voluntary engagement of its faculty members and senior students. Several alumni of KISS hailing from indigenous and poverty stricken background have been brought to the mainstream of the society.

6. The University also continues to do social surveys through its community engagement center. 10 children from Bihar who were living below poverty line under extremely dire conditions were admitted to KISS to provide them a decent life and happy childhood.
7. 6000 + first generation learners have been converted from below poverty line to mainstream tax payer status.

SDG 2 : ZERO HUNGER

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 2 associated with zero hunger :

1. Masters programme (Business Administration) in Agribusiness Management is being offered in the University. Agribusiness includes all the activities that take place from the farm to the final consumers. It covers the agricultural inputs, production, processing, distribution logistics and marketing all the agricultural products. With liberalization and globalization, tremendous amount of opportunities have been created in this sector. The agribusiness sector in India today lacks the trained and skilled managerial professionals to manage the current challenges and take it to greater heights, with an aim to prepare qualified and well trained professionals to cater to various needs of the agribusiness sector. This course has direct relevance to agricultural input industry, food processing industry, retail industry, development sector, E-commerce, agricultural commodity trading center,

agricultural warehousing sector and agricultural export houses. 25 students are pursuing this course. It is expected that the graduates of the course will become responsible professionals contributing to the proper functioning of food commodity markets and their derivatives.

2. Health care centers, medical camps and wellness clinics have been established in different districts of the state to spread medical awareness and provide treatments free of cost.
3. Junior doctors and interns were involved in surveying the malnutrition issues among children and women particularly in villages, collect information and provide advice and treatment as required.
4. Medicines were distributed to the ailing villagers, malnourished children and afflicted women in the district of Kandhamal as an initiative of the Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, hospital under KIIT.
5. The community engagement center and the student society (under National Service Scheme) worked in close association with each other as a voluntary

initiative to study social, economic, medical and cultural issues in different villages of the state , wherein malnutrition and food security issues are also covered. NSS volunteers were involved in distribution of food packets in orphanages and rural areas in different times of the year.

6. NSS volunteers visited Padmakeshripur Village on account of 'Poshan Abhiyan' promoted by Ministry of Women and Child Development on 9th and 10th September, 2019 and created awareness centered around nutritional requirements and inculcation of healthy eating habits among the adolescent children.

SDG 3: GOOD HEALTH AND WELL BEING

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 3:

1. Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS), the medical unit of the University is 2000 bedded super-specialty hospital in the city of Bhubaneswar. All medical services and facilities are available 24x7.

2. All students and staff members are covered under medical insurance and have got 24x7 access to all medical facilities of the KIMS.

3. Counseling cell has been set up to address the issues associated with stress felt by staff members and students if any.
4. Medical clinics exist in different districts of the state providing free medical services and aids to the people of the region and is solely managed by KIMS, the medical unit of the University.
5. Rural Health Centre with Tele-medicine Facility established in Kalarabanka in Odisha state of India provides health-care services to the people of the village and nearby villages. The Centre had been set up by KIMS, has tele-medicine facilities which allows people of the area to avail expert consultation from eminent doctors of the super-specialty hospital at their doorstep. It also regularly conducts health camps in the village. Local people have benefitted immensely due to health-care facility and awareness by the 100-bedded primary health centre. Likewise, KIMS has made available latest and affordable medical facility through the tele-medicine centre in many parts of the state.

6. Clinical Specialists at KIMS provided remote health consultation including diabetic, Rheumatology, Nephrology and other super specialty consultation services, facilitating the regular interaction of doctors and patients of the village for follow up and obtaining expert clinical opinion.
7. KIMS facilitates capturing of patient health data and preservation for certain period time and retrieval for medical analysis, as and when necessary at the time of follow up visits. The interaction with the patients of the village by doctors in KIMS and treatment history are being transcribed and preserved as medical records. The vital parameters of remote patients (like BP, ECG, etc.) are visible to doctors through Tele-presence solutions

and there is end-to-end integration of Bio-medical equipment, and video conferencing equipment.

8. Mobile Clinic, High-end patient care including super-specialty services were provided at the door step.
9. Medical camps and awareness programs have been organized in different districts of the state of Odisha to spread awareness on proper hygiene, sanitation, infectious disease control, prevention measures, healthy nutrition for different age groups, and ill effects of tobacco products and alcohol consumption.
10. Wellness clinics have been established in the city of Bhubaneswar and are several districts of the state by the University supported by its medical unit. These clinics provide services associated with naturopathy treatment, counseling services, rehabilitation and de-addiction therapy. So far, more than 1500 people have been cured of mental tension and severe addiction.

11. Awareness Programme on the various dimensions of occupational health and safety, the issues and challenges in the construction and agricultural sectors of India, and to identify good working practices, behaviors, and ideas for workplace, was conducted during 2019 with 51 participants.
12. Training Programs were organized by School of Medical Sciences on basic life support, cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid, and on fire safety and prevention during 2019 with 200+ participants across the state.

13. The University has initiated the School of Yoga to emphasize on the yogic practices and its benefits. Awareness programs and special sessions are conducted round the year for students and staff members. The International Yoga Day was celebrated on 21st June, 2019 amid great enthusiasm. Approximately 91% staff members participated.

14. Health Camp was organized by Faculty of Nursing Sciences, 4th year intern students and Pradyumna Bal Memorial Hospital supervisor of KIMS jointly in collaboration with Kalinga Institute of Nursing Sciences on the occasion of World Health Day-2019 on 7th April at different parts of Bhubaneswar. Health

checkup of more than 1000 people was done by the health personnel in the camp to create awareness and promote healthy living.

15. KIMS extended its medical support by sending 25 member medical team to Kerala on 22nd August, 2018 to render medical services to flood affected people. The team of doctors took a ground level understanding of the situation and offered timely assistance to the people whose houses surged into the water and mud following the flood. Around 40 houses in this area submerged into the flood waters which carried tons of mud, stones and large barks of trees. The KIIT flood relief assistance provided at Kerala was primarily based on three parts, i.e. Medical

Assistance, Counseling and Mapping the struggles that people faced during floods and the Post Flood Situation which was revolving around rehabilitation process.

16. Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy Center with all types of ultra modern physiotherapy and occupational therapy equipment has been established on July 27, 2019.

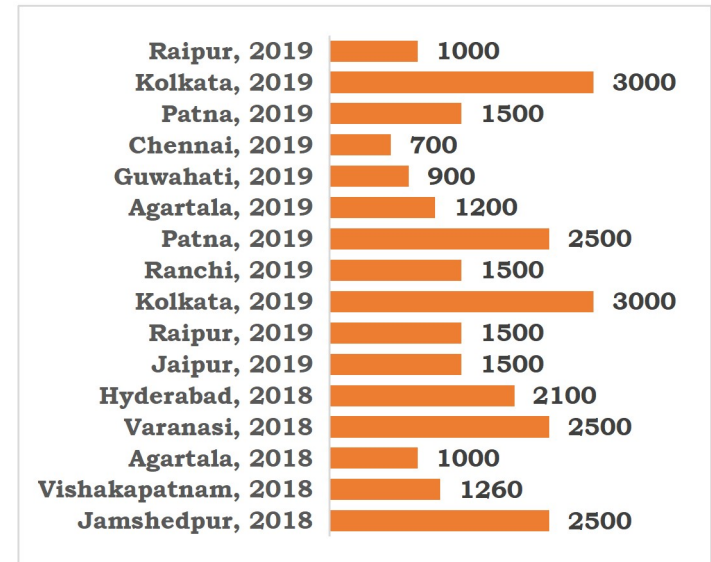
17. The Mega Health Camp with free medicine distribution was held in every block headquarters of the four districts- Kandhamal, Boudh, Nayagarh and Ganjam on first Sunday of every month. The programme was held in 20 blocks of these districts in first phase. Doctors, specialists and para-medical staff from KIMS joined the camp and provided health services. Besides, the mega health camp was also held in district headquarters twice a month. Doctors and specialists with modern medical equipment were available in these health camps

SDG 4 : QUALITY EDUCATION

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 4 associated with education both at national and international level:

1. The University provides free education to the tribal students coming from the poorest of the poor communities in different undergraduate and post graduate degree programs taken up after counseling.
2. The faculty members and students of the University are voluntarily engaged in educational activities at its sister organization, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) to prepare the children and students for higher studies. Details about KISS are provided in Appendix-I.
3. The faculty members and students from different societies under the umbrella of KIIT Student Activity Center and National Service Scheme have been actively engaged in educational outreach programs beyond the campus in villages, Schools and Orphanages.

4. The University has adopted 10 Panchayats , villages and 16 schools in the state with the commitment to provide them with all facilities and support for quality education and employability skills. Dedicated team comprising University staff and student coordinators from different societies have been actively involved in educational outreach activities in these regions and schools.
5. The University provides free access to its digital resources through its central library for students, researchers, scholars and faculty members from all institutions. Free access is also provided to its magazine lounge KEN, Kavya, Kamyaa, Gandhian library ‘Karamchand’ and Jagannath temple spiritual library.
6. Motivational programs to inspire the youth for higher studies are carried out every year through ‘Education for All’ summit and ‘Education for All’ marathon. More than 1million people motivated to join higher education.

7. The University provides free access on request to different laboratories across different departments (including research labs, centers of excellence and business technology incubation cell to carry out tests on innovative ideas and do research work).
8. A horde of guest lectures, seminars, workshops and conference were organised which were open for the general public. Details are given in Appendix-II.

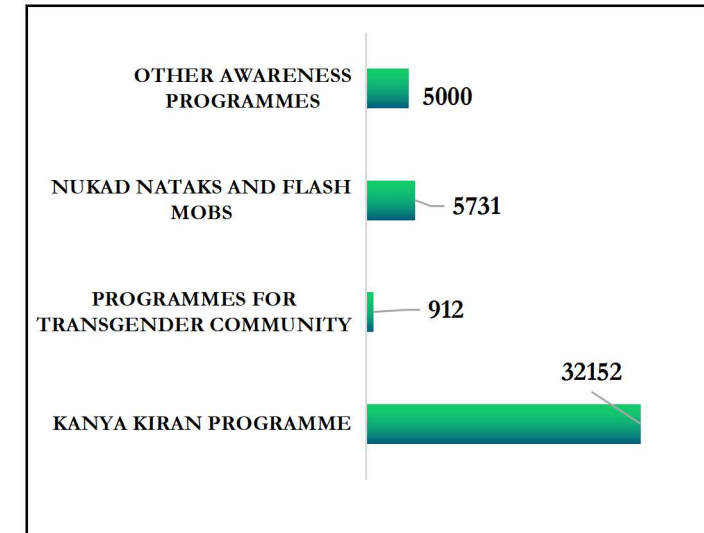
9. The University also provides skill development training under different Government schemes like Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana scheme and Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana scheme to the unemployed youth to make them job ready .Details of the Skill development programs are given in Appendix-III.
10. The University has been acting as an advisor to the Royal Government of Bhutan and is actively involved in providing skill development training to the youth of their nation.
11. Dedicated placement cell exists to maintain liaison with the corporate and different job sectors to facilitate placement for its students graduating from different programs; the students hailing from tribal background are provided with special mentoring for placement; placement drives are also organized for the trainees under skill development programs. More than 10000 youth have been employed.
12. School of Computer Applications of KIIT Deemed to be University, Bhubaneswar, organized three day Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp (EAC-2019), which was sponsored by National Science & Technology Entrepreneurship Development Board (NSTEDB), Department of Science and Technology-National Implementing and Monitoring Agency for Training (DST-NIMAT),Govt.of India, New Delhi during 23-25th March, 2019. This programme was monitored by Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDII), Ahmadabad, Gujarat, India. This programme was conducted to inspire the students for innovation and start ups.
13. 'Kanya Kiran' program had been launched in association with United Nations Women and Kalinga Fellowship. In a mobilization of scale and spread unheard of before, the program covered all the Panchayats of the State of Odisha in India, spreading awareness on gender equality and social evils of violence against women and girl child among millions of households. Over 3000 staff of the University, particularly women staff was actively involved as coordinators and volunteers. They disseminated the message at household level in villages amid overwhelming response. The Women folk also were made aware of hygiene and environmental issues.
14. Research on academic topics around SDGs is also being given importance in the University. Research on Quality education leading to quality papers is being carried out. The list of papers on quality education published in 2018 and 2019 are given in Appendix IV.
15. A wide spectrum of Centers of Excellence have been set up in the University with knowledge and technical support from different organizations to carry out quality research, studies and innovations in avenues of sustainable development goals. Details are given in Appendix-V.

SDG 5: GENDER EQUALITY

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 5 associated with gender equality in workplace and in the state of Odisha, India:

- 1) As per the norms of the Government of India, 30% seats in all programs are reserved for women candidates. The University has a female representation of about 49% in Engineering and technology disciplines and approximately 50% in others during 2019.
- 2) Two out of the three students who won Founder’s Gold Medals for their outstanding all round and academic performance in 2019 were girls.
- 3) There is female representation of over 35% in the University workforce.
- 4) There is a significant representation of women among the senior management of the University including Deans, Directors and Hon’ble Pro Vice-Chancellor.

- 5) The University also conducted recruitment drives for transgenders. The University has appointed a transgender, as its Social Development Officer becoming the first in the private sector India to appoint one. It worked towards the welfare of the transgender community in different aspects.
- 6) ‘Kanya Kiran’ programmes in association with United Nations Women and Kalinga Fellowship, were organised in all districts of Odisha in 2019. In a mobilization of scale and spread unheard of before, the program covered all the Panchayats of the State of Odisha in India, spreading awareness on gender equality and social evils of violence against women and girl child among millions of households. Over 3000 staff of the University, particularly women staff was actively involved as coordinators and volunteers.
- 7) Other awareness programs and Nukkas Nataks (street plays) were carried out in different districts of the state by KIIT student societies to emphasize the importance of women in household and society.

SDG 6: CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 6 associated with clean water and sanitation:

1. KIIT Green, the bold initiative of KIIT University to control environmental pollution and to create a healthy ambience in and around 25 sq. km. area in which different campuses of KIIT are located has been successfully implemented. Different new units for rain water harvesting and sewerage treatment was added to various buildings and was taken care of by KIIT Green team.
2. Water supply to all campuses, units and residential complexes is provided only after proper treatment and purification.
3. Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM), Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (SBA), or Clean India Mission is a Pan India campaign initiated by the Government of India in 2014 to stop open defecation and improve solid waste management. KIIT and its student societies regularly and annually take part in the SBM to spread awareness on the health dangers of open defecation. Several public toilets have also been set up by the University in remote areas to prevent open defecation.
4. KIIT initiated Tap Drinking Water Project with support of the Govt. In Kalarbank, model village. Clean tap drinking water has been supplied to each household of Kalarabank village. The project has brought down incidence of water borne diseases, which were widespread earlier.
5. Currently three research projects are ongoing which are associated with SDG 6 as mentioned below:
 - a) 'Toilet Stories from a Coastal Village of Odisha:-A Participatory Study of Sanitation and Social Change' in collaboration with Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education.
 - b) 'Relationship between household sanitation and woman's experience of menstrual hygiene under Swachha Bharat Mission (Clean India Mission) in Odisha', in collaboration with Indian Council of Social Science and Research (ICSSR).
 - c) 'Estimation of Garbage and quantification in and around Bhuasuni Dumping Yard' in collaboration with the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation, Odisha, India.
6. Jal Diwas was celebrated on 22nd July, 2019 as part of the JAL Shakti Abhiyan initiated by Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi to emphasize on Jal Sanchay or Water Conservation and Water Resource Management.

SDG 7: AFFORDABLE AND CLEAN ENERGY

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 7 associated with affordable and clean energy:

1. KIIT Green envisaged and implemented various pollution control plans in the campus. The University had taken up the ambitious plan of making the campus totally vehicle free. In the first phase, use of bikes, both by students and staffs, has been prohibited, after putting in place an effective alternative transport arrangement.
2. Besides mass plantation and limiting vehicular pollution, other environmentally friendly initiatives under KIIT Green were setting up new rain water harvesting and water management, sewerage treatment, biogas, solar water heating systems, etc in the newly constructed buildings in the campus.
3. The interdisciplinary center of energy with special reference to renewable energy is operational in the University to address the targets set by SDG 7. Research projects, surveys and studies on effective utilisation of new sources of energy are being carried out here.

4. All the campuses, units and hostels of the University are equipped with solar panels to utilize the heat and solar energy abundantly available in our Country.
5. Energy audit was carried out in the University as its conducted on an annual basis.
6. Awareness camps have been organized in different rural areas to propagate the message in the use, advantages and maintenance of solar ovens and solar lamps.
7. Several projects was being worked in the domain of renewable energy and associated domains in collaboration with Government organizations:
 - a) 'Development of CZTS based solar cells by Co-evaporation method' in collaboration with Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. (Prof. U.P.Singh)
 - b) 'Process Development for Fabrication of CZTS based solar cell on flexible (polyimide) substrate' in collaboration with Ministry of New and Renewable Energy. (Prof. U.P.Singh)

- c) 'Process Development of Thin Film Solar Cells from Abundant and Non-toxic Materials' in collaboration with Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), DST, Government of India. (Prof. U.P.Singh)

8. The automobile society of the University has developed green vehicles (powered by solar energy and electric battery) for commuting within the campus.

9. 3rd International Conference on Solar Energy Photovoltaics" was held from 19th – 21th December 2019. The Conference provided a platform to exchange knowledge about the latest scientific and industry results and to discuss the latest trends and developments in photovoltaics.

The training were imparted by experienced University staff members on use of file handling, communication skills and business communication writing, basic accounting, ICT technology and Digital skills.
2. The tribal and unemployed youth were referred to the Skill Development Center for training in different schemes under Government initiatives (Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana scheme and Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana scheme) to the unemployed youth to make them job ready .Details of the Skill development programs are given in Appendix-III.

SDG 9: INDUSTRY, INNOVATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 9 associated with Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure:

1. Industry Engagement cell liaised with the industrial and corporate sectors for requisite collaborations. These associations resulted in various developments in our organization in terms of innovation and cutting edge research.
2. Several Centers of Excellence have been established in the University with technical or knowledge support from various industrial/corporate sectors as well as research organizations like National Instruments, SAP, IBM corporation, Texas Instruments, Siemens, Bosch, Schneider Electric, Mercedes Benz, Tech Mahindra, Berufsgnossenschaft-Der Bauwirtschaft, Germany, Intel, Boeing India, Department of Science and Technology, Indian Space Research Organization, Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council. Details are given in Appendix-V. All these centers were involved in research revolving around various SDGs and product innovations.

3. KIIT- Technology Business Incubator (KIIT-TBI) cell provided an appropriate platform and environment with a world-class infrastructure of around 120,000 sq. ft. that offered a range of incubation facilities and services to the prospective entrepreneurs to convert their innovative ideas into commercially viable products and till date, it has already incubated and mentored 200+ ventures, 250+ technologies and 4000+ job creations.
4. Entrepreneurship Cell functioning in the campus has been helpful in fostering entrepreneurship culture amongst the students and establishing necessary support systems for aspiring entrepreneurs. The students are being connected to mentors, funds and the platform to bring their ideas into existence is being provided.
5. Four entrepreneurship awareness camps were conducted in 2019 which comprised of motivational lectures, business quizzes, personal interactions and industrial visits.
6. Research papers have been published during the year reflecting the research outputs and innovations by the University's students and faculty members.

7. A number of products have been patented and the details are given in Appendix-VI. 18 patents have been published and 1 granted during 2018. 5 patents have been published during 2019.
8. The School of Civil Engineering was involved in research and consultancies involving resilient infrastructure. The details are given in appendix-VII.

6. KIIT has helped more than 6000 first generation learners to come out from their unrecognized lives inside the jungle to social mainstream and helped to lead a decent life. This initiative was aimed to address the economic inequality.
7. The University conducted skill development programmes for school dropouts and unemployed youth to motivate them to learn customized design skills as per their interest and pursue their career in that direction. Not only the students are skilled as per the field of their choice, counselors also counsel them to take up jobs available in different sectors to earn their livelihood. In 18-19,

KIIT has trained youth of Odisha through various skill development programmes and placed them in the large companies, NGOs and financial sectors. The details of the skill development training programmes are given in Appendix-III. This initiative was aimed to address the economic inequality.

8. 'Kanya Kiran' programmes were organised in 2019 in association with United Nations Women and Kalinga Fellowship. 2. There was mass destruction of natural beauty of green city of Bhubaneswar uprooting trees and destroying shelters for the poor due to Fani. The University authorities planned, carried out a mega plantation drive and planted 1 lakh trees in and around the campus to restore the natural beauty of the campus and the city of Bhubaneswar soon after the cyclone.

3. The automobile society of the University was working on the development of cost effective green vehicles powered by solar or electric power to launch them for affordable, pollution free commutation services. These vehicles have been deployed for testing within the University campus.

SDG 12: RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION

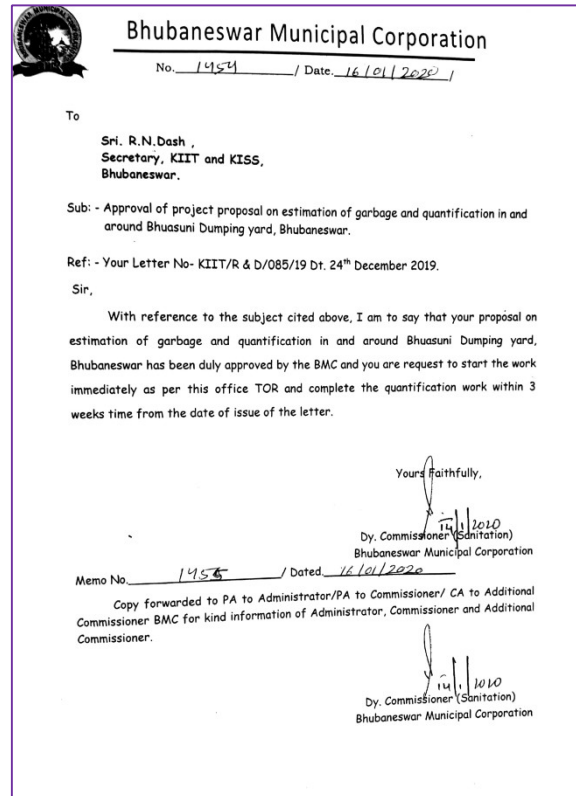
Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 12 associated with responsible consumption and production:

2. The Biogas Development and Training Centre set up under the aegis and financial support of the Ministry of New & Renewable Energy, focused on the R&D affairs in bio-energy and conducts awareness camps as well as skill development training courses in the rural locations of the designated states besides the on-the-field monitoring and inspection activities as per the guidelines envisioned in the National Biogas Manure Management Programme (NBMMP). Apart from these, the centre is also mandated to organize staff course and turn-key programme for evolving latest technological trends in bio-energy and execution of those interventions at grassroots level.

3. The University has strict policies to deal with wastes and hazardous chemicals from its chemical and medical units respectively keeping in view the SDG target 12.4.
4. Energy audits in the University were carried out in 2019 similar to past year .

SDG 13: CLIMATE ACTION

Initiatives in place to address the Sustainable Development Goal 13 associated with climate action:

1. Awareness camps were organized in different parts of the state on issues on global warming and climate change. This was conducted by students from societies under KIIT Student activity center. 1000+ persons benefitted
2. 'ENACTUS KISS-KIIT' was an innovative initiative by some students of KIIT to improve the quality of life in society. Under the initiative, in 2016, Project SIDDHI was undertaken, which provided opportunity to the oppressed communities in and around Bhubaneswar to change their lives for the better and, in the process, eliminate the use of plastic bags by replacing it with handmade paper bags. This initiative is still active. It contributed in significant way in addressing the use of non degradable plastic bags with degradable paper bags.
3. The extremely Severe Cyclonic Storm Fani was the strongest tropical cyclone to strike the Indian state of Odisha during March 2019 since the 1999 Odisha cyclone. It had destroyed the natural beauty of green city of Bhubaneswar uprooting trees and destroying shelters for the poor. The University authorities planned and carried out a mega plantation drive to restore the natural beauty of the campus and the city of Bhubaneswar soon after the cyclone.
4. The automobile society of the University successfully worked on the development of cost effective green vehicles powered by solar or electric power to launch them for affordable, pollution free commutation services. These vehicles have been deployed for testing within the University campus.
5. A KIIT Knowledge tree lecture took place on July 19, 2018 on Poverty and Climate change as key challenges for mankind by the University. SDG 14: LIFE BELOW WATER

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 14 associated with life below water:

1. The University worked on conservation of ecosystem in coastal regions in the state of Odisha along with several cleanliness drive along the beaches.
2. Awareness camps were organized to spread the need for sustainable ecosystem in coastal areas. Initiatives are underway to reduce pollution/debris from coastal areas and sea water near to the beaches.
3. The Chilika Development Authority (CDA) in its objective to protect Chilika lake genetic diversity and effectively utilize the bio-resources has undertaken several long-term research initiatives in collaboration with reputed Indian institutes such as CIFRI, BNHS, IISER, RPRC, and Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology, Deemed to be University. These studies are based on ecologically and economically vital component of Lake Ecosystem such as fishes, birds, macrophytes, benthos, and microbial communities of Chilika Lake ecosystem. The Chilika Development Authority and the KIIT School of Biotechnology have initiated a systemic

approach to culture and characterize the bacteria from different sectors of lake as outlined below:

- i. Documentation and conservation of bacterial resources
- ii. Spatial and temporal dynamics of bacterial communities in context to nutrient cycling
- iii. Isolation of novel bacteria and enzymes useful in biotechnology industries
- iv. Monitoring of pollution and fecal indicator bacteria.

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 15 associated with life on land:

1. Cyclonic Storm Fani was the strongest tropical cyclone to strike the Indian state of Odisha during March 2019 since the 1999 Odisha cyclone. The effect of Fani included widespread destruction the natural beauty of green city of Bhubaneswar uprooting trees and destroying shelters for the poor. The University authorities planned and carried out a mega plantation drive to restore the natural beauty of the campus and the city of Bhubaneswar soon after the cyclone. 1 lakh trees were planted for this.
2. The School of Civil Engineering undertook numerous consultancy services on Material Testing (Concrete Mix Design, Quality testing of construction materials like Cement, Aggregates, Bricks, Tiles, Reinforcing bars & Ply, Soil Testing, Water Testing both for drinking purpose as well as concrete use (Mixing & Curing), Accelerated curing of concrete and Testing. In addition, the School also undertakes Structural Design & preparation of Drawing, Vetting of Structures, provides the Clients “Quality Engineers” for various works.

The School has developed competency in the areas of slope stabilization/ landslide protection work/ widening of Ghat sections using advanced technology such as soil nailing, gabion wall, reinforced earth wall and ground improvement using stone column solutions and established as a Centre of Excellence in the Country. SDG 16: PEACE, JUSTICE AND STRONG INSTITUTIONS

The Center of Excellence on Sustainability and Equity was established in 2019 to create awareness among its students, staff and general public about the needs and importance of sustainable development goals, their importance and impact on the progress of our nation. This Center of Excellence is working on gathering, measuring and analyzing data related to different sustainable development goals both at national level and international through its collaborations, partners, NGOs, surveys and research activities. It is also working towards more collaborations at national and international level, NGOs and corporate to frame policies and decide on plan of action to meet the goals associated with the SDGs.
2. KIIT Legal Aid and Assistance Clinic have been working in the campus with an aim to provide free legal aid services to anyone and everyone who approached them.
3. Wellness clinics have been established in the city of Bhubaneswar and several districts of the state by the University supported by its medical unit. These clinics provide services associated with naturopathy treatment, counseling services, rehabilitation and de-addiction therapy. So far, more than 1500 people have been cured of mental tension and severe addiction.
4. Public Policy Research Centre had been established for impacting social and technical policy formulation process with an emphasis on good governance practices, efficient implementation mechanisms and evidence-based policy making.
5. 'Kanya Kiran' program had been launched in association with United Nations Women and Kalinga Fellowship. In a mobilization of scale and spread unheard of before, the program covered all the Panchayats of the State of Odisha in India, spreading awareness on gender equality, importance of women in society and social evils of violence against women and girl child among millions of households. Over 3000 staff of the University, particularly women staff was actively involved as coordinators and volunteers. They disseminated the message at household level in villages amid overwhelming response.
6. Other awareness programs have been carried out by the student societies on cyber-bullying and cyber crime, and on 'Good Touch and Bad touch'.
7. The University was involved in expert opinion and advice through its involvement with a horde of national and international organizations under the umbrella of associations and councils. The University is member of Indian Science Congress Association, Indian Commerce Association, Indian Society for Technical Education, Indian Social Science Congress, Khelo India Organization and Association of Indian Universities (AIU) to name a few.
8. Academicians of the University are members of different policy making bodies and those working under the aegis of the Government.
9. The University was appointed as a mentor institute under the
10. 'Paramarsh' scheme of NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) to extend all sorts of support to those institutions waiting for accreditation in different stages. Eleven colleges and one University have signed their MoU with KIIT to be the mentee institutions.
11. KIIT TBI, an initiative of the University supported by Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India offers

incubation facilities and enables the incubatees to work in a secure, innovative and entrepreneurial environment as they progress through various stages of entrepreneurial development. The Technology Business Incubator (TBI), established with the view to serve as an Incubator for potential entrepreneurs, serves as a focal point for entrepreneur development, patent support, etc.

12. The University has been the advisor of Royal Government of Bhutan on Higher Education. The University has been imparting special training and skill development programmes to Teachers, Principals and Officials of Government of Bhutan since 2017.

13. The University was involved in a large number of policy focused research in collaboration with government department/ organizations. More than 100 research projects in emerging areas and SDGs were ongoing in collaboration with government agencies like DST, DBT, BRNS, MNRE, ICSSR etc. List of major projects ongoing are provided in the appendix-II.

14. Various seminars, Conferences and events were organized in collaboration with government agencies with emphasis on policy focus research.

SDG 17 (PARTNERSHIPS FOR GOALS)

Initiatives to address the Sustainable Development Goal 17 associated with partnerships for goals:

1. The Center of Excellence on Sustainability and Equity was established in 2019 to create awareness among its students, staff and general public about the needs and importance of sustainable development goals, their importance and impact on the progress of our nation. This Center of Excellence worked on gathering, measuring and analyzing data related to different sustainable development goals both at national and international level through its collaborations, partners, NGOs, surveys and research activities. It is also working towards more collaborations at national and international level, NGOs and corporate to frame policies and decide on plan of action to meet the goals associated with the SDGs.
2. The University collaborated with Odisha Rural Development and Marketing Society, Panchayati Raj, and Drinking Water Department, Government of Odisha to conduct Skill Development Programs under Deen Dayal Upadhyal Grameen Koushalya Yojana.
3. The University had collaborated with All India Council of Technical Education to conduct Skill Development Program under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana Scheme.
4. The University had collaborated with Royal Government of Bhutan to conduct skill development programs for the potential Youth of Bhutan.
5. Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) had joined hands to extend the benefits of skill development to tribal youths living in the backward districts of Odisha. The two organizations signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) in New Delhi on March 30, 2017 to establish a Centre for Excellence to demonstrate technology-enabled blended skill training model for tribal youth. Currently the Skill development Programs are being imparted jointly by the faculty members from KIIT and KISS with practical resources from both these sister organizations.
6. The Kalinga Fellowship is an initiative bringing together eminent leaders from business, Government, academia and civil society to engage in deliberations and contemplation on issues and policies to combat trafficking of women and children. Initiated by three partner organizations, The Bridge Institute, Ashoka and the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences, the first fellowship was organized in April 2017 in Odisha, India. Thereafter, a 10-year commitment was formed in an MOU (in 2017) to implement the nine strategic action plans framed during the first fellowship and create similar programs to establish zero tolerance of sexual assault on women and children across Asia. Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology, Deemed to be University, the sister organization of KISS works in close association with it through its staff members and students to make the strategic plans a success.
7. The University had MOUs with 66 corporate organizations. Several Centers of Excellence have been established in the University; working on several SDGs. Details are available in Appendix-V.
8. The University was also in dialogues with different embassies and embassy representatives visit annually to motivate students for higher studies, a

step towards attaining & fulfilling sustainable development goal on Quality Education. The University has tie ups with foreign government and embassies to provide quality education to students from other countries with attractive scholarship schemes.

9. 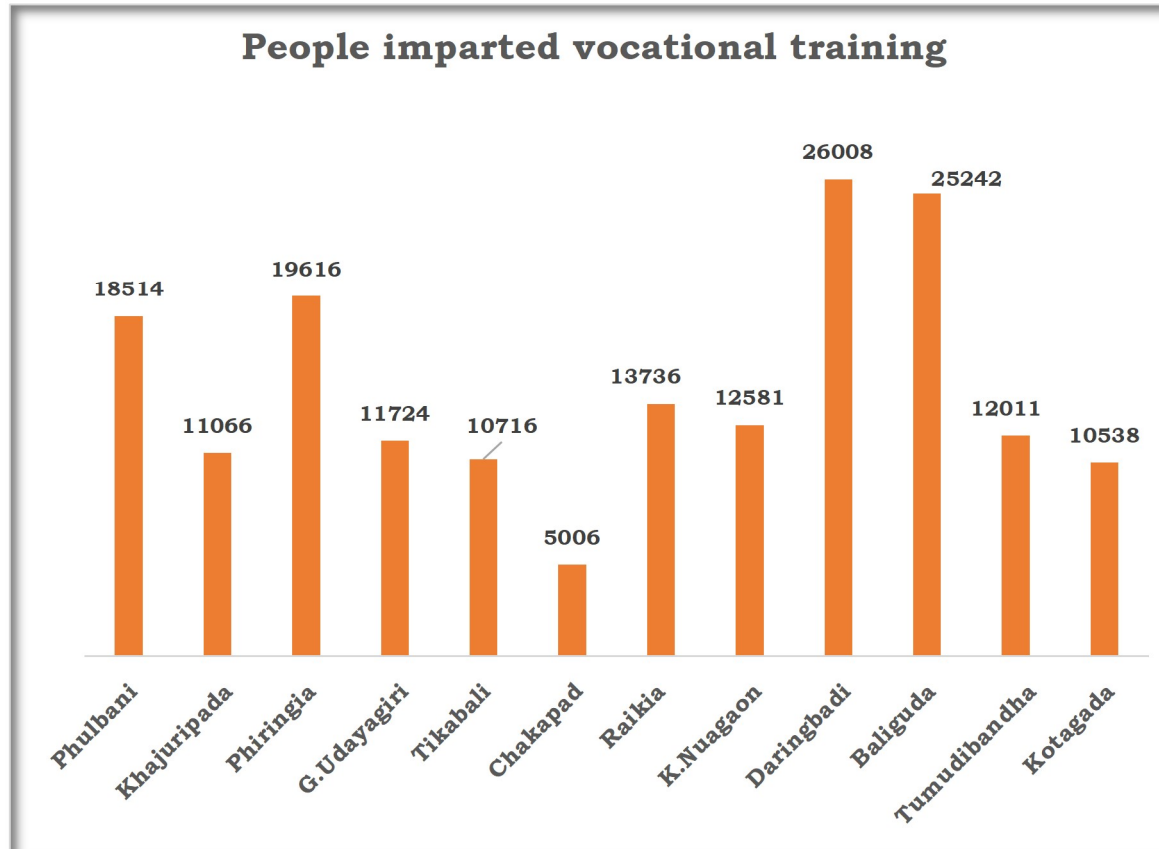
